How long are the internships?

Our internships are 8-10 months, for a maximum of one year.

Why do we ask for 8-10 months?

The learning curve is steep and it takes time to learn about the roles and the responsibilities within them. In the time spent, interns are able to thrive, develop useful skill and make significant contributions to the organization. Furthermore in order to maintain consistency within our programming we require individuals to commit 8-10 months to ensure quality in expanding our initiatives.

Can I go to school as I do my internship?

Due to the full time commitment of the internship, it is not possible to attend weekday classes while on the internship.

What kind of skills will I develop during the internship?

Internships responsibilities are broad. Interns can expect to gain 8-10 month experience in this setting, with the potential to learn various skills such as project management, time management and priority setting, leadership skills, public speaking, facilitation experience, presentations, report writing and other skills which vary from internship positions.

What kind of education do I need?

While many of our interns are graduates from universities majoring in international development, political science, economics, anthropology, business studies, languages, journalism, we consider individuals who are passionate about social issues from a variety of disciplines and experiences.

What is the compensation for the internship?

There are two streams of compensation for a 8-10 month internship:
\$1000 per month plus shared room in housing OR \$1000 per month plus a metopass for public transportation while living in Toronto.
